Review Appointment

On Monday, June 24, the Ad Hoc Committee on Planning Commission and Board of Motor Vehicle Review Appointment interviewed 9 candidates for consideration of appointment for **one vacant seat** on the Charlotte Mecklenburg Planning Commission, and 1 candidate for consideration of appointment on the Board of Motor Vehicle Review. The Committee was comprised of Commissioners Dumont Clarke and Kim Ratliff.

For the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Planning Commission, the Committee interviewed Wayne Powers, Marshall Williamson, Laurissa Hunt, Nancy Bowen Wiggins, Kwesi Nichols, Mike Sullivan, Amanda Wolfe, Joel Randolph, and Sam Spencer, who were nominated at the May 21, 2013 meeting of the Board of County Commissioners.

For the Board of Motor Vehicle Review, the Committee interviewed Chris Price, the sole applicant nominated at the June 18, 2013 meeting of the Board of County Commissioners.

The Committee makes the following recommendations:

The Committee did not feel comfortable making a formal recommendation to the Board for the appointments to the one vacant seat on the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Planning Commission, since only 2 commissioners were able to serve on the interview panel. The Committee does recommend that the Board choose the appointee from the following 4 applicants, who stood out during their interviews: Amanda Wolfe, Kwesi Nichols, Michael Sullivan, and Marshall Williamson. The Committee members will speak to the qualifications of each candidate during the appointment discussion.

The Committee agreed to recommend the appointment of **Chris Price** to fill the vacant position on the Board of Motor Vehicle Review.

Mr. Price is employed at Wells Fargo, where he has experience in lending to consumers for the purchase of motor vehicles. He is active in his community, serving as President of his HOA, volunteering for Habitat for Humanity, and serves as an alternate on the Town of Huntersville Board of Adjustment.

The Board of County Commissioners will make one appointment to the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Planning Commission at its July 2 meeting. The appointment term will expire June 30, 2016. The Board of County Commissioners will also make one appointment to the Motor Vehicle Review Board at its July 2 meeting. This appointment term will expire July 18, 2014.


