What:

Working together to create a regional growth framework that will enable us to promote growing jobs and the economy, improving quality of life and controlling the cost of government. Planning for growth will help ensure healthy growth for our communities and region.

Whv:

In the past decade, our region has emerged as America's fastest growing region of any area with a population greater than 1 million people. That rapid growth is expected to continue, with our population growing by 50 percent in the next 20 years and doubling in about 40 years. That's an addition of more than 2 million people.

Who:

Residents from throughout the region, including representatives of local government, education, business, economic development, non-profits and other organizations, will work to create a regional growth framework.

More than 100 local governments and other organizations are participating in this "CONNECT Our Future" initiative.

How:

The regional growth framework will be developed through extensive public engagement – more than 30 open houses throughout the region this year – and it will build on what communities identify as existing conditions, future plans and needs, and potential strategies.

Where:

The 14-county bi-state region includes: Anson, Cabarrus, Cleveland, Gaston, Iredell, Lincoln, Mecklenburg, Rowan, Stanly and Union Counties in North Carolina, and Chester, Lancaster, Union and York Counties in South Carolina.


