Subject: Report of the Lake Norman Commission Ad Hoc Interview Committee

On Wednesday, September 10, 2025, the BOCC Ad Hoc Interview Committee interviewed nominees for two seats on the Lake Norman Marine Commission. The Committee comprised myself, Commissioner Meier, Commissioner Rodriguez-McDowell, and Commissioner Townsend-Ingram.

After interviewing the nominees, the committee recommends to the full Board the appointment of Richard Gaskins for one (1) four-year term expiring September 30, 2029, and Gregory "Greg" Truesdell for one (1) five-year term expiring September 20, 2030, on the Lake Norman Marine Commission.

The Board is scheduled to make an appointment to the Lake Norman Marine Commission at the September 16, 2025, Board of County Commissioners Meeting.
