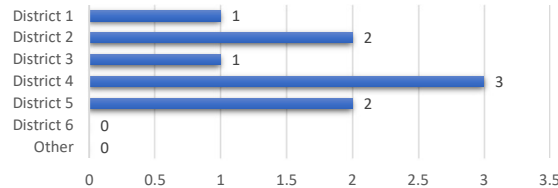

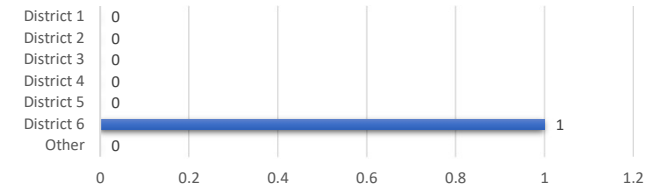

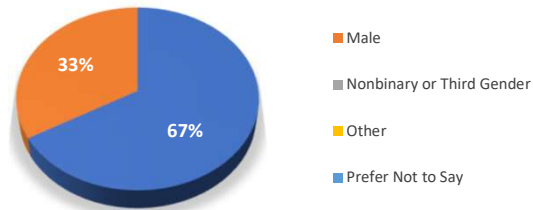

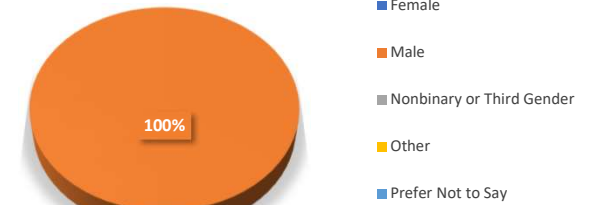

Members by Gender



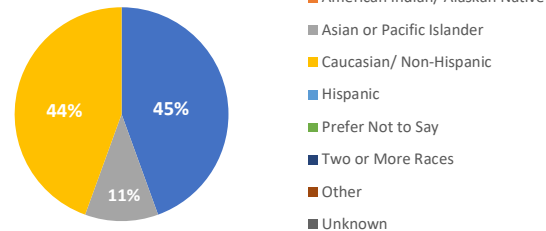

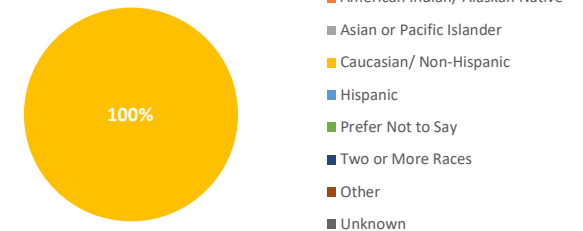
