Staff Response(s)	 The CDC -Ending the HIV Epidemic grant funds will be utilized within the Ending the HIV Epidemic program (Preventive Health Division). Funds for the Bridge Access Program for COVID-19 Vaccines will be utilized in the Immunization program (Clinical Services Division). Both funding sources come as Agreement Addenda from the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NC DHHS) – NC Division of Public Health. NC DHHS received the funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The CDC Ending the Epidemic grant program targets those at the highest risk for contracting HIV. In terms of age, those at higher risk are young adults. The public benefits through improved population health and reduced healthcare costs. The Bridge Access Program for COVID-19 Vaccines provides COVID-19 vaccines at no cost for adults 19 years and older without health insurance and adults whose health insurance does not provide zero-cost coverage for COVID-19 vaccines. This program benefits the public because it makes the COVID vaccine available to individuals who cannot afford it.
