Animal Evolution BIO-311: "The Relationship between Bite Force and Head Size in Carnivora," January 2019 – May 2019.

- My classmate, Shalina Floronesc, and I hypothesized that the increase of head width leads to an increase in bite force in Carnivora, which indicates an evolutionary relationship between head size and bite force performance. Bite force has been investigated in the past with relations to morphological factors, such as rostrum, mandible, skulls and muscle attachment areas.
- We have collected data from 15 different species of Carnivora without the consideration of the degree of evolutionary relationship between the species. A mathematical equation (Bf =(T\*I t+M\*I m)/Io) was applied to obtain maximum bite force data. These variables included in the equation represent vectors about the temporomandibular joint, where T stands for temporalis and M for masseter, since previous data supports the assumption that the vectors used acted through their respective centroids perpendicular to the plane of the muscles cross-sectional area. Io stands for the out-lever moment arm reaching to the center of the upper carnassial and upper canine.
- To display the evolutionary relationships and detect a potential coevolution of the two traits, a mirror phylogenic tree was established using a modular system for evolutionary analysis called Mesquite.
- The Pearson correlation test concerning the skull with of the zygoma and the bite force in Carnivora showed a highly significant linear increasing correlation between the two variables. The size of bite force increased simultaneously with the amount of bite force in each species.

Advanced Cellular and Molecular Concepts BIO-402: "The Impact of a Range of Soursop Doses on *Daphnia magna* and *Daphnia pulex*; a Dose-Response Toxicity."

- Daphnia, a crustacean water species were widely used in toxicological and other biological studies, since they are widely distributed in aqueous environments. Daphnia's reaction to a specific agent allows to predict how the toxicity level could impact other species including human beings. Furthermore, due to their clonal reproduction, their offspring are genetically identical. Their genome has already been well studied, which gives the opportunity to analyze toxicological outcomes and use them as the perfect study model. In addition, they are easy to maintain, feed, and grow in large number, which makes them inexpensive. In this study, Daphnia magna and Daphnia pulex were exposed to different concentrations of soursop to investigate its impact on the mortality.
- It was hypothesized that in comparison *Daphnia magna* have a lower lethal concentration (LC50) than *Daphnia pulex*, as well as juvenile *Daphnia pulex* have a decreased LC50 compared to adult *Daphnia pulex* (decreasing LC50 in the following order *Daphnia magna* > adult *Daphnia pulex* > juvenile *Daphnia pulex*).
- A software for statistical computing and graphics called R was used to analyze the lethal concentrations (LC50). Due to the results, the hypothesis was rejected because as expected *Daphnia magna* displayed the lowest LC50 value being exposed to different concentrations of soursop compared to all other groups. However, data was found that 50 % of juvenile *Daphnia pulex* die at a lower concentration compared to the adult *Daphnia pulex*.
