Emergency medical response, treatment & transport


Scheduled non emergency transport

Performance Matters

Response Time Compliance/Contract	NA	98%
Response Time @ 90th Percentile	> 16 minutes	< 11 minutes
ROSC (Utstein)	± 5%	82%
Patient Survival to Discharge (Utstein)	< 5%	51%
Trauma Scene Time	>13 mins	8 mins, 23 secs
Patient Satisfaction	52% Excellent	65% Excellent
Employee Satisfaction	16% Excellent	24% Excellent
County Funding per Transport	\$429	\$115




Changing Landscape

- Significant increase in demand for service




Demand Growth
