The funding was increased by \$149,324 and is being applied to the CIP/LIHEAP budget to help with marketing and other services. Programs are located in the Economic Services Division within the Department of Community Resources

Staff Response(s)	For the Mecklenburg County Public Health Breast Cancer and Cervical Control Program (BCCCP), there are several new fees related to procedures newly covered by the North Carolina BCCCP program. The new fees are:
	<ol> <li>Colposcopy of the vulva for \$86.10</li> <li>Colposcopy of the vulva with biopsy \$115.30</li> <li>Colposcopy of the entire vagina with cervix, \$90.56</li> <li>Colposcopy of the entire vagina with cervix with biopsy for \$122.09</li> <li>Colposcopy of the cervix including upper/adjacent vagina with loop electrode for \$258.10</li> </ol>
	All other BCCCP fees were decreased, including the standard cervix colposcopy. Mecklenburg County Public Health also added a lab test (\$5.61) for syphilis.  In addition, the Environmental Health program introduced new fees prescribed by state statute. These include:  1) Engineered Option Permit for \$35  2) Onsite Wastewater Evaluator for \$35  3) A2 Session Law Improvement Permit/Construction Authorization Combo for \$180  4) A2 Session Law Improvement Permit/Construction Authorization Alteration for \$120.

The funding supports two environmental specialists and operating costs (equipment replacement, supplies repairs etc.).</li> <li>All county residents benefit from the operation of the fine particulate matter network. The data is used for daily air quality forecasting and for determining compliance with federal health-based air quality standards.</li> </ol>

The North Meck Recycling Center is our busiest center and receives over 1,000 customers on a typical Saturday. This is a planned expansion and is part of our Strategic Plan.
