

Release & Detention Decisions

- » Approximately 38,000 arrestees are booked into the Mecklenburg County Arrest Processing Center
 - Mecklenburg County Sheriff's Office, FY 2014 Annual Report
- » This process initiates the pretrial stage of the criminal justice system & requires a critical decision
- » Pretrial release & detention decision
 - Whether to release or detain a defendant pending case disposition
 - If released, the setting of conditions



Release & Detention Decisions

- » Goal during the pretrial stage, and especially the pretrial release & detention decision, is to
 - Protect public safety
 - Assure court appearance
 - Honor a defendant's right to pretrial release on the least restrictive conditions

Release & Detention Decisions

- » Pretrial release & detention decisions carry enormous consequences not only for defendants, but also
 - Safety of the community
 - Rights of victims
 - Integrity of the judicial process
 - Effective utilization of our criminal justice resources



Release & Detention Decisions

- » Research has shown that release & detention decisions impact
 - Case disposition
 - Likelihood of receiving a sentence to incarceration
 - Length of the sentence to incarceration
 - Public safety pretrial (short term)
 - Public safety post-disposition (long term recidivism)

Release & Detention Decisions

- » Release and detention decision involves pretrial risk
 - Risk is inherent in pretrial release
 - Our system of justice requires that we take risk
 - The question is not "do we take risk"
 - The real question is "how do we measure risk and how do we manage it"

Measuring & Managing Risk

- » Measuring and Managing Risk
 - Measure Risk
 - Employ objective and research-based risk assessments to identify the risk to public safety and failure to appear in court
 - Manage Risk
 - Preventive detention
 - Implement supervision and services to mitigate the risk of pretrial failure for released defendants

Measuring & Managing Risk

- » Measuring Risk
 - A pretrial risk assessment is an objective, research-based instrument that relies on risk factors to predict the likelihood of success or failure for a released defendant pending case disposition
 - Intended to inform the decision to release or detain a defendant by measuring
 - Danger posed to public safety
 - Likelihood of appearing in court
- » Mecklenburg County implemented the Public Safety Assessment – Court (PSA – Court) in June 2014

Measuring & Managing Risk

- » Measuring Risk
 - PSA Court is a pretrial risk assessment which relies on administrative data (charge, criminal and court appearance history, and criminal justice status) to predict three pretrial failure types
 - Failure to Appear (FTA)
 - New Criminal Activity (NCA)
 - New Violent Criminal Activity (NVCA)
 - The tool is racial and gender neutral it accurately classifies defendants' risk levels regardless of their race or gender, meaning it does not have a discriminatory impact

Measuring & Managing Risk

- » Effectively measuring risk allows for
 - Detaining the highest risk defendants
 - Releasing moderate risk defendants with interventions and services targeted to mitigate risk
 - Releasing low risk defendants with minimal or no conditions
- » Mitigating risk requires effective risk management strategies for the moderate and higher risk defendants

Risk-Based Pretrial System

- » Risk Management
 - Risk management involves adherence to the risk principle
 - Studies have shown [pretrial/post-conviction]
 - Evidence-based interventions directed to moderate and high risk defendants/offenders will result in better outcomes for both defendants/offenders and the community
 - Treatment resources targeted to low risk defendants/offenders produce little, if any, positive effect

Risk-Based Pretrial System

- » Risk-Based System
 - Highest risk defendants are detained
 - Moderate risk defendants are released with supervision and services to mitigate risk of pretrial failure
 - Lowest risk defendants are released at the earliest point possible with minimal or no conditions

Risk-Based Pretrial System

- » Risk-based systems minimize dual system errors found in many existing pretrial systems
 - Defendants who pose a significant risk to public safety are released
 - Low risk/non-violent defendants are detained
 - In Mecklenburg County
 - Some moderate risk defendants are released without interventions and services intended to mitigate risk
 - Current policy limits the Court's ability to order supervision and services in appropriate circumstances

Risk-Based Pretrial System

- » Benefits of a Risk-Based Pretrial System
 - Improves public safety in the short and long term
 - Enhances the fair administration of justice
 - Better protects the rights of victims
 - Better protects the rights of defendants
 - Reduces the burden on local tax payers
 - Provides for the most effective jail population management of pretrial defendants
