Live in an area that does not have a drop option?

There are medicines that are of higher risk to your family to keep around such as prescribed pain medicine known as opioids. In this case the FDA recommends disposing at home. Use coffee grounds or cat litter mixed in a baggie with the medicine and throw in the trash to keep your family and friends safer.
