




The Community Health Opinion Survey asked residents to select the 4 issues they thought needed the most attention.

1,800 Responses




Brief community presentations took place during October and November 2017.

The community Priority Setting Event took place on December 8, 2017 at UNC Charlotte.


Participants heard presentations on the 9 health issues from subject matter experts.

Presentations were followed by table discussion and individual ranking of each issue.



### 1. Mental Health




Adults who *reported mental health not good* for at least 8 out of the past 30 days (BRFSS, 2017)



### 2. Access to Care


#### % Without Health Insurance Mecklenburg




Adults who report not being able to see a doctor due to cost.

Lack of Exercise




#### **Healthy Eating**

### 4. Violence Prevention





In 2016, homicides were the 2<sup>nd</sup> leading cause of death for persons aged 15 – 24 years.

The rate of homicides in Mecklenburg **increased by 54%** between 2014 & 2016.
