- 39.2 million non-institutionalized Americans have one or more disabilities
- 70 percent of all Americans will, at some time in their lives, have a temporary or permanent disability that makes stair climbing impossible
- 8,000 people survive traumatic spinal cord injuries each year
- 11.1 million Americans have serious hearing disabilities
- 7.3 million Americans have visual disabilities
- 20.6 million Americans have limited mobility



What is ADA?

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) is a civil rights law that prohibits discrimination against individuals with disabilities in all areas of public life, including jobs, schools, transportation, and all public and private places that are open to the general public.

Law & Legal Requirements

Title II Requires that State and Local Organizations:

- Designate an ADA Coordinator
- Provide Notice of ADA Requirements
- Establish Grievance Procedure(s)
- Conduct Self-Evaluation and Create Transition Plan
- Implement Modifications & Monitoring

Self-Evaluation Process

Self – Evaluation Purpose:

- Identify barriers in programs & activities that prevent persons with disabilities from access (includes evaluation of policies/practices)
- Identify physical barriers within public entity facilities that make structures inaccessible or unusable by individuals with disabilities



Self-Evaluation Process

Transition Plan: Purpose

- Set forth steps necessary to remove barriers identified through selfevaluation process
- Describe methods to remove all obstacles
- Specify a schedule and identify person responsible
- Estimate cost(s) and record completion date

Phase III – Public Website Accessibility

The following steps have been completed or are underway to ensure that websites meet ADA standards compliance:

- Created Web Content Editor position to ensure site accessibility
- Updated MeckNC.gov design to improve accessibility
- Hired consultant to assess current County website(s)

 Assessment will be completed by May 2018
 Remediation of website compliance issues is ongoing
 Maintenance will include ADA Compliance training for staff



Phase IV – Facility Assessment Pilot

- County has more than 360 existing buildings, greenways and parks
- Infrastructure can vary from office space to parks and rec centers

Methodology

- County will utilize a nationally recognized ADA Assessment tool to review all County spaces
- \odot Staff has participated with similar Library Assessment
- Survey training will be provided by ADA Consultant
- \odot Building staff will assist with preparing for assessment
- Post Pilot evaluation will examine lessons learned



Phase V – Facility Assessment Continued

- The "Pilot" will help to inform the continuing facility review process
- Facility review is typically a multi-year process that will be determined by building age and customer usage
- The facility review process will be completed during the summer months and may leverage local university and college students



Program Review:

- Complete pilot recommendations and deliverables
- Establish full project plan for remaining department reviews

Facility Review:

- Request of approximately \$65,000 for FY19
- Prepare to begin Facility Assessment Pilot Summer 2018
- Create training for customer service and ADA Awareness
