During 2017, the WAB agreed that a refocus was necessary in order to ensure continued success and growth. The refocus began with a revision of both the Mission and Vision statements.

SUCCESSES

During the annual Board retreat in January, 2018 the WAB determined their top goals for the next several years. All agreed the first priority was researching the greatest needs of women in Mecklenburg County in order to better advise the County Commissioners. As a result, the following four subcommittees were formed:

- Homelessness and women
- Women's and Children's Access to Healthcare
- Gender Based Income Disparity
- Workplace Harassment

As of 2018, turnover of board members continues to be a struggle; however, the board is committed to using the high attrition rate as an opportunity to better diversify membership when vacancies are filled.

One of the goals in the refocus of the board is building name and brand recognition through community outreach, hosting guest speakers at the monthly board meeting, and attending or participating as vendors at local events.
