1. Program Description of how funds will be used to achieve goals, objectives and outcomes:

The funds will be used to develop a Fatality/Critical Incident Response Team. This team will respond to child protective services workers who are assigned a fatality or critical incident on a new or open case. The team will utilize best practices to ensure that the secondary traumatic stress that comes with crisis response is minimized and less impactful.

2. How would this grant align with the strategic plan and how will it strengthen the Departments Mission?

The grant will strengthen the agency mission by working towards cultivating an agency culture that is compassionate and understanding towards staff just as we are clients. Staff emotional and mental health must be tended to in order for the highest level of services to in turn be provided to children and families in Mecklenburg County.

The grant allows for best practices in responding to secondary traumatic stress which is a job hazard for child protective services work. The success of the program will be seen through retention and decreased worker burnout.

The grantor will evaluate Mecklenburg County on appropriate use of funds, through the number of fatalities and critical incidents responded to, and through the success of the programming. The program will also be evaluated by the strength of collaboration between Child Fatality Review Teams, Local Child Fatality Prevention Teams and Community Child Protection Teams, the State Child Fatality Prevention Team, and the Child Fatality Task Force.

Once the grant ends, a request will be made to reapply for the grant to continue the positions.

Each of the positions will be managed by a YFS pre-custody manager. The clinicians will require offices and working equipment, as well as a county permit for travel.
