In 2018, the Women's Advisory Board continued to restructure and reorganize itself. Turnover of the board members continued to be a struggle; however, the board is committed to using the high attrition rate as an opportunity to better diversify membership when vacancies are filled, which has been evident with the last two filled positions. The board is starting to show the diversity that is seen in Mecklenburg County.

The board members began working toward more name and "brand" recognition within the community. This was accomplished through community outreach, hosting guest speakers at the monthly board meetings, and attending or participating as vendors at local events.

The Board continued to work toward improved communications with the County Commissioners. A mid-year report was presented on October 16, 2018 with an update on the Board's progress. The presentation was well-received and the WAB feels encouraged to continue a more frequent and open dialogue with the Board of County Commissioners.

CHALLENGES

The Board has experienced ongoing inability to have an impact in the community and in obtaining results without any financial support, social media or online presence of any kind. Additionally, the board has no budget and is unable to facilitate change or even purchase simple items such as a table runner for events to better identify ourselves. The goal of the WAB is to convey to others in Mecklenburg County not only the events we put on and/or participate in, but also to be a more central hub to share/disseminate any information or event that would be of interest on the topic of women in Mecklenburg county.

In an effort to be transparent regarding Women's issues nationally, the board needs to recognize the controversy around the National Women's Equality March. The local Women's equality march separated from the national organization due to the controversy around the political role of the national leadership. But on the positive side, the local march had a great turnout with a good local, county and state leadership presence.

LOOKING FORWARD: 2019

The Board had an all-day retreat on February 18, 2019 where the group strategized on the following:

- Setting board goals
- Committed presence of a County Commissioner at the yearly Women's Advisory Board Retreat
- Methods for having a larger visibility in the county within our described constraints
- Offer meaningful suggestions to the County Commissioners. This information will be presented to the County Board of Commissioners on April 16, 2019 in our 2018 Annual Report.

We have adopted the theme of 'Empowering women in the workplace', which was a goal put forth by the County Commissioners during the mid-year report. Some of the action items the Board identified for this goal include:

- Sponsoring a Community Service Day. This will be at Dress for Success to assist women in the workforce.
- Hosting a Women's Equality Day event in August where the focus will be sexual harassment.
- In the coming months, the WAB will focus on issues of sexual harassment and will explore policy recommendations to promote harassment-free workplaces and environments.
