FY 2020 Capital Ordinances



- Request to approve funding for FY2019-2023 Capital Improvement Plan projects
- Add \$39 million in funding to accelerate greenways and increase land acquisition budget for park and recreation
- Accelerate funding for other greenway projects to achieve 30 miles by 2023





Capital Improvement Program FY 2019-2023

- The County 5-year strategic Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)
 - o Funds Government Facilities, Schools, Libraries, Central Piedmont Community College, and Park and Recreation
- Board approves the 5-year CIP, funds through capital budget ordinances
- Capital budget ordinances provide multi-year funding over the life of the project
















FY 2020 Ordinances—Park and Recreation

- Increase total funding from \$1.57 billion to over \$1.6 billion
 Increases include:
 - Adding five new greenways for an additional 10.1 miles by the end of FY2023
 - Adding \$2 million for Park land acquisition, over the \$33 million in the existing CIP
 - Ordinances also reflect acceleration of greenway projects
 - Accelerate six greenways projects to complete earlier than originally planned to achieve 30 mile greenway goal



FY 2020 Ordinances—Schools

 Ordinances implement planned CIP spending for CMS

- Initiates new school projects scheduled to start in FY2020, as outlined in the 2017 School Bond Referendum
 - Career and Technical Education (CTE) upgrades
 - Two new elementary schools and additions to relieve crowding
 - East and West Mecklenburg High School Renovations
- Provides \$239 million for construction costs for other projects already initiated in previous fiscal years












Current FY 2019-2023 Capital Improvement Program


FUNDING ALLOCATION BY CATEGORY



- CIP revised total \$1.6 billion*
- Amended CIP includes:
 - o \$930 million for schools
 - \$298 million for Park & Recreation
 - o \$158 million for Government Facilities*
 - \$151 million for Central Piedmont Community College
 - o \$67 million for Libraries
