

# COMMUNITY INVESTMENT Investing in Community & Innovation

- Since the new Cultural Vision Grants replaced ASC's former project grants program in FY17...
  - ASC has received 270 applications for funding
  - 135 grants awarded to 90 different organizations and individuals
  - \$751,055 total investment
  - 1,180,376 audience members reached
  - 41% of awards to first time applicants/grantees
  - 40% of awards to projects led by communities that have historically been under resourced in the philanthropic community, including African-American, Latinx, Asian, Arab, and Native American, LGBTQ and Differently Abled
  - 53% primarily serving audiences in these communities.
- For FY19
  - **\$247,840** total investment
  - 45 awards

Creative Renewal Fellowships – (7) \$10,000 awards to local creatives in FY19; **43%** artists of color

Regional Artist Project Grants - \$46,907 to Mecklenburg County artists in FY19; **47%** artists of color



# BUILDING ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY & SOCIAL CAPITAL

### **Culture Blocks**

- Making cultural experiences more accessible to residents, since inception:
  - Grown from 5 to 9 geographically specific communities; expanding to 10 in FY20
  - 1,185 programs
  - 40,329 participant experiences
  - 40+ programming facilities
  - 55 cultural organization partners
  - 30 creative individual partners
- New relationships with:
  - 35+ community groups, and
  - 40+ new cultural program partners






# **EDUCATION & SECTOR SUPPORT**

## **Investing in Education**

### **FY19 School Funding Program**

- \$245,000 68,000 students and 3,600 teachers experienced arts, science, and history programs via School Funding Opportunities (SFO)
- 16 teachers in 14 schools received \$10,000 in Professional Development scholarships
