V. Name of civic/community activities, position of leadership and dates of involvement: John Stevens was a stalwart of North Carolina pickleball. He was a terrific player and an even better person. He was always a great ambassador for the sport, trying to spread the word of pickleball to many different communities throughout North Carolina. John was involved in conducting exhibitions to teach and showcase pickleball to people of all ages. Although he was much better than most players, he always provided encouragement to players of all skill levels and tried to help them improve their game. When he passed away unexpectedly, it profoundly affected the entire pickleball community – men, women, beginners, intermediates, and advanced players - a testament to the kindness he exhibited to players of all ages and abilities. John spearheaded the effort to convince Mecklenburg Parks and Recreation to include pickleball lines on the tennis courts at Tuckaseegee Park in 2016. These outdoor pickleball courts were the first of its kind in the Charlotte area and are used regularly now by players of all skill levels.

John was also very instrumental in persuading Mecklenburg Parks and Recreation to build eight dedicated pickleball courts at the new, upcoming Clarks Creek Community Park. These dedicated pickleball courts will be the first of its kind in the greater Charlotte area, and the entire pickleball community is excited for its opening.

- VI. Organizations and positions held: John was in charge of the Charlotte Pickleball Club and would answer questions from players inquiring about the game, looking for places to play, or looking for potential partners for upcoming tournaments.
- VII. Awards and honors: John was one of the best pickleball players in North Carolina and won numerous medals over the years with various partners. He was always gracious in wins and defeats. He has won more medals than shown below, but these are the awards that are on record in pickleballtournaments.com.

APPENDIX A

I. Tuckaseegee Park: When the pickleball courts opened at Tuckaseegee Park, there were several articles that mentioned John Stevens as the driving force behind convincing Mecklenburg Parks and Recreation to include pickleball lines on the tennis courts.

New Courts Open at Tuckaseegee Park

Over 30 area P'ballers met at Tuckaseegee Park on the 22nd of June to celebrate the Grand Opening of 6 outdoor Pickleball courts. The newly resurfaced courts are lined for both Pickleball and Tennis and are lighted. Located at 4820 Tuckaseegee Rd, Charlotte, NC 28208, the courts are





a lob and a dink away from Uptown Charlotte. The Rec Center at the park has nice clean shower facilities for those who might want to sneak away from the office midday and return without smelling like an old pair of gym socks. A Sign-Up Genius has been created to make everyone aware of who

is planning to play on each specific day (see Pickleball Venues at the end of this newsletter for the link). The Courts are available first come, first serve from 8:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. everyday and the times in the sign up genius are just there for convenience. Feel free to get your own group together at a different time. These are Public Courts and are meant to be used!



- II. Fund Raiser: At the March Madness Pickleball Tournament held recently at Caroline Courts in Concord, there was a fund raiser that raised over \$2000 in John's name. Subject to Mecklenburg County Parks and Recreation's approval, the thought behind the fund raiser was to donate the proceeds to Mecklenburg County Parks and Recreation to purchase viewing/sitting benches that could be installed at or near the new Huck's Road Community Park pickleball courts. In addition, the proceeds would be used to purchase a commemorative plaque memorializing (a) John's efforts in bringing pickleball to Clarks Creek Community Park and (b) John's efforts in promoting pickleball throughout Charlotte.

March Madness is in the books!

We just wrapped up March Madness, a great pickleball event in Concord, NC. I could not believe how friendly, nice, and cooperative all of the players were. It makes me proud to be a pickleball player. It truly brings out the best in all of us. Watching how the people interacted during the matches…laughing, calling balls out on themselves, hearty congrats after losing and winning, respectful watching and cheering for the good shots, not just the ones your favorite players hit...... all these things contribute to the experience. Thank you so much for the way we treat this sport.

The John Stevens raffle was a great success. For those that weren't here, we asked for donations to a fund in memory of our good friend who passed away in late 2018. The idea is that John's family and close friends want to honor him by purchasing some permanent benches on the pickleball courts at the new Huck's Road Park. The plan is to put engraved plaques with an inscription showing thanks to John for his hard work in helping establish Huck's as a pickleball venue, as well as his efforts at bringing public pickleball to other places in the Charlotte area. Well, folks really opened their hearts and wallets and we raised \$2029. That is so awesome!

IV. Memorial Tournament in John's Name: We would like to establish an annual tournament in John's name. Proceeds from the tournament would go to a foundation in John's name that can be used to continue the legacy that John left by funding pickleball-related projects that John would be passionate and proud of in Charlotte (e.g. paddles and balls for kids, etc.). We would work collaboratively with Mecklenburg Parks and Recreation to determine where the proceeds could best be used. A document outlining the ideas and plans for the tournament was sent to Michael Jackson at the Mecklenburg Parks and Recreation department and he subsequently sent it to Michael Moraglia. A copy of the document is attached below:

JOHN STEVENS PICKLEBALL TOURNAMENT

- A. Goal: Establish an annual pickleball tournament in John Stevens's name.
 - John was very passionate about pickleball in North Carolina and was instrumental in various pickleball-related projects over the years. In particular, he was the driving force behind implementing pickleball at Tuckaseegee Park as well as the upcoming courts at Clarks Creek Community Park.
 - 2. Proceeds from the tournament will go to a scholarship or foundation in John's name that can be used to continue the legacy that John left by funding pickleball-related projects that John would be passionate and proud of in Charlotte (e.g. paddles and balls for kids, etc.).
 - 3. We'd like to have a plaque (or equivalent) that can be placed at Clarks Creek Community Park and/or Tuckaseegee to honor John's legacy. This could perhaps be done in conjunction with the tournament.
- **B.** Location: Clarks Creek Community Park pickleball courts.

C. Dates:

- 1. We'd like to hold the tournament sometime during the upcoming summer or early Fall. This would give us the best chance to avoid a rainout.
- 2. The tournament would be two days (Saturday & Sunday), with open practice available the day before the tournament.
- 3. We'd have to work around some of the other tournaments around the area as well as some national tournaments that already have dates in place.

D. Registration / Publicity:

- 1. Nearly every pickleball tournament in the country (both USAPA sanctioned and non-sanctioned tournaments) uses pickleballtournaments.com to allow participants to register and pay on-line for the event. It's also a vehicle to easily manage the tournament brackets (winner's and consolation brackets up to and including the gold, silver, and bronze medals).
- 2. There is a cost to use the pickleballtournaments.com software, but we would just pass that cost on to each participant during the registration process.
- We can publicize the tournament through Facebook and several pickleball forums. Having participants will not be an issue, and we will likely have to cap the number of participants in each division due to the limited number of courts.

4. John was a high-level player (4.5/5.0 level) who had many different doubles partners over the years and many opponents who admired his game and well as who he was as a person. We've received numerous inquiries regarding a tournament in his name, so we expect that many high-level players would participate in the event. It would be a great opportunity for the public to see high level pickleball in the Charlotte area and it would also provide great exposure for the new Clarks Creek Community Park.

E. T-Shirts

- 1. A commemorative t-shirt will be given to each participant. Proceeds from the tournament will pay for the t-shirts.
- 2. John's wife Gillian will design the t-shirt. She mentioned that she'd like to have John's initials inside a circle on the upper left chest and the words "Is this for the belt?" on the back of the shirt. The phrase "Is this for the belt?" was a question John posed frequently on the pickleball court to determine who the winner was for the day. Gillian also mentioned that he would use it in everyday events outside of pickleball because he was so competitive.
- 3. Gillian can get the t-shirts at wholesale through her company and can also get them screen-printed. She mentioned some of John's favorite shirt colors were red, royal blue, and black.
- **F. Potential Tournament Names:** Some potential names are:
 - 1. John Stevens Memorial Tournament
 - 2. John Arthur Stevens Memorial Tournament
 - 3. John Stevens Pickle Palooza
 - 4. John Arthur Stevens Pickle Palooza
- **G. Fundraiser:** We would try to raise some money during the tournament for the scholarship/foundation through the following:
 - 1. 50/50 Raffle: People can buy raffle tickets and 50% of the money goes to the winner, and the other 50% goes to the scholarship/foundation.
 - 2. Autographed Item: We could have a silent auction for an autographed item. An example would be a signed basketball or football.
 - 3. Food/Drinks: We could perhaps raise additional money by selling food/drinks during the event.

H. Miscellaneous:

- The tournament would be co-ed, so everyone can participate. To draw the
 most people, it would likely have a number of different skill levels similar to
 other pickleball tournaments and as mentioned earlier, be played over a two
 day period.
- 2. With our pickleball connections as well as the affinity that so many people had for John, we would likely be able to gather a number of volunteers to help run the event.

- 3. A belt would be given to the winner of the Men's and Women's Open division. Medals will be awarded to second and third place in the Open division. In all other divisions, medals would be awarded for first, second, and third place. Proceeds from the tournament will pay for the belts and medals.
- 4. Information about the tournament will be provided to the entire pickleball community so people that John knew who don't live in the area can participate in the event.

APPENDIX B

Letter from Gillian Stevens (Wife of John Stevens)

My husband, John, stumbled upon Pickleball one day while exercising at the JCC. After a good workout we were both exhausted, but John, always the competitor, teasingly ran to beat me to the water fountain. An elderly onlooker laughed and said, "Wow, you are fast... and clearly like to win! Have I got the sport for you." John got a kick out of the old man's spirit. The man asked us if we had a minute to follow him into another gym. Intrigued, we went and it is no exaggeration to say that day, a passion was born. One hour on the Pickleball court was all John needed to become its biggest fan!

Having grown up an avid tennis and ping-pong enthusiast, Pickleball was right up John's alley. The perfect mix of exercise, skill and fun, this game had all of the qualities John desired. He loved that it was open to all ages and skill levels, yet was quite the workout. When he first started, John was playing Pickleball bi-weekly. Over the next ten years, this increased to almost daily. It wasn't long before he started playing competitively in tournaments all over the Southeast and, more importantly, made friends in every city we visited. In the ten years that John played, his name became synonymous with Pickleball in the Carolinas. We were excited to travel to New Mexico this June for John to compete in his second Senior Olympics. He was so proud to be competing again and to represent the Carolinas' Pickleball community. John was known not only for his skill but also for his heartfelt commitment to this growing sport.

When John first picked up Pickleball, his only concern was how few places there were to play in Charlotte. At the time, Pickleball was just finding its way down South and most people had never heard of it. John was dedicated to changing that problem and worked on it diligently for years. He fostered a relationship with Jim Garges promoting the sport and helped to identify under-utilized tennis courts that could be converted into Pickleball courts or have lines painted to provide a dual use. He went to many facilities to help teach interested participants to play Pickleball. He helped with court planning and dimensions in proposed facilities. Because of John's energy and commitment, the first Pickleball courts were painted for dual use at Tuckaseegee Park a few years back. John was so grateful, and this free and available use helped grow the sport exponentially in the Charlotte area. But for John it was just a start, as his true goal was to see dedicated courts built at one or many parks in the Charlotte area. This year, due in part to John's hard work, that goal will become a reality at the new Clarks Creek Community Park. He was so thrilled - he would drive out to the site monthly just to check on the progress! He could not wait to walk on those courts this Spring.

It would be impossible for words to express what John's sudden loss has meant to my family. He is missed every minute of every day. The joy that comes with the hope that John's name, efforts and belief in this sport, would be uttered when a group gathers at Clarks Creek Community Park, to enjoy the game he loved, comforts us in a way that could not be replicated elsewhere. It would be such an honor for him, and therefore, for us all.

If there is anything I can do to assist in this process, I would love to help. I want to thank you so much for your consideration. It means the world.
