The Mecklenburg County Sheriff's Office is requesting the Board adopt the above referenced Resolution to transfer ownership of retired Mecklenburg County Sheriff's Office Canine Officer Aggie.

Due to their specialized training, the Canine Officer Aggie would be a danger to public health and safety if adopted by or sold to a member of the general public who is unfamiliar with their law enforcement training. The Canine Officer Aggie is of no economic value to Mecklenburg County, NC and therefore, pursuant to authority granted by NCGS 160A-266(d)(iii), can be transferred without
